The *Stations of the Cross* is an ancient spiritual practice that remains vital and important to this day. The *Stations* invite us to walk Jesus' Via Dolorosa, standing witness to his descent from Pilate's court, his journey beneath his cross through the dusty streets of Jerusalem, his stripping, nailing, crucifixion, and descent to the tomb.

These woodcut images depict the traditional 14 Stations. They include scenes that elaborate on the New Testament Passion narrative, in much the same way as the texts of many Christmas carols.



May these images join with your prayers, enriching your devotions for Lent, Holy Week, and across all seasons of the year.
